Green Policy of Ismailsaheb Mulla Law College, Satara

Introduction

Right to life guaranteed under Indian Constitution as fundamental right, requires healthy environment to live healthy life. Providing clean air and water, safe habitats, sufficient and healthy food is the biggest challenge today considering the enormous pollution of environment and depletion of scarce natural resourses. From local issues like unsafe drinking water, to global environmental issues like urban smog, global warming, deforestation etc. are now contistantly discussed at global level. It must be noted that, environmental protection and conservation can be achieved only through multi-sectoral efforts, and by spreading environmental literacy through awareness programmes at all levels.

Ismailsaheb Mulla Law College aims, to develop environmentally sensitive & cautious law students with constructive learning approaches which emphasis on activities related to environmental conservation and awareness.

Our eco-friendly building with good air ventilation and air corridors that help in cooling the temperature as well as allowing maximum natural light is the first step towards reducing the power consumption.

Our faculty, staff and students regularly conduct activities like tree plantation, seed & sapling plantation, reducing paper consumption, creating awareness about environment friendly practices, etc. and are taking conscious efforts towards protecting the environment through organising various awareness and sensitization programmes.

Apart from plantation, the college has also taken up rainwater harvesting, for which a drainage system has been developed to accumulate rainwater near the plantation area in the college premises. - 11. To provide safe and potable drinking water to staff and students.
- 12. To follow eco-friendly and sustainable practices to manage the available resources.
- 13. Visual signage boards for generating awareness about conservation of water and electricity and green policy to be displayed in the college premises.
